PLANTS CAN BE HARMFUL

There are many plants which can be poisonous causing nausea, vomiting, diarrhea and even death. Many gardeners know that the foliage of potatoes, and the green potato sprouts, contain a poisonous substance called solanine. The same substance may be found in the green outer parts of the potato after it has been exposed to light. And why does nature allow us to eat the stems of rhubarb with immunity yet allows the blade of the leaf to contain a poison which, if eaten, causes extreme illness? It is never too early to know about the dangerous properties of such garden bulbs as narcissi, hyacinth, daffodils, and others, if eaten. RECIPE FOR MUSHROOM MEATBALLS

1 can (10 1/4 oz) cream of mushroom soup.
 1/2 cup water
 1 lb ground beef
 1/4 cup fine dry bread crumbs
 2 tbsp. minced onion
 1 tbsp minced parsley
 1 egg slightly beaten
 1 tbsp shortening

Mix soup with water. Combine 1/4 of soup mixture with beef, bread crumbs, onion, parsley, and egg. Shape into meatballs (about 1 1/2" thick) brown in shortening in frying pan. Pour off drippings; add remaining soup mixture. Cover, cook over low heat 15 minutes; stir occasionally. Serves 4.
