Meet the Candidates October 30

All-Candidates meetings will be held for the ratepayers of both Millbrook and the Township of Cavan on Wednesday, October 30. Both meetings will be held at the Cavan Municipal Hall. Cavan Township will hold their meeting upstairs in the auditorium starting at 7 p.m. The Millbrook meeting is being sponsored by the Millbrook and District Chamber of Commerce.

In Cavan Township there is a contest for the position of deputy reeve, as well as for the three councillor positions. In Millbrook, four seats on council are being contested by six nominees.

Candidates for the position of trustee on the Public School Board will be invited to appear at both meetings to answer the questions of ratepayers. There are four candidates running for this position. Representation on the school board has taken on added importance in the area since the issue of closing the high school in Millbrook arose in 1984. In a strong show of community support, the high school was saved, but some feel that the issue may reappear if steps are not taken to upgrade the facilities at the school.

Among the other issues being addressed by the candidates for trustee are teacher-pupil ratios and busing.

Since the elected trustee will represent public school supporters in South Monaghan as well as in Cavan and Millbrook, ratepayers from South Monaghan are invited to attend in order to voice their concerns and hear the comments offered.

Dr. Jim Liston defends referendum question before Cavan Council

Referendum on Peace will be included on Millbrook and Cavan Ballots

Both Cavan Township and Millbrook will include a question regarding global nuclear disarmament on the municipal election ballot in November.

At the meeting of Cavan Council held on October 15, a delegation from Millbrook People for Peace met with Council to discuss the question. The citizens group had received a letter from Cavan Council stating that Council would not present the question on the advice of their solicitor. Reeve Vic Norman, at the October 15 meeting, referred to the letter as "a breakdown in

communication", and declared the issue still open for discussion.

Dr. Jim Liston spoke on behalf of Millbrook People for Peace, arguing that the issue of nuclear disarmament is one of public health and safety, and as such, does fall within the jurisdiction of municipalities. He pointed out that Premier Peterson when opposition leader, and the then Attorney-General Roy McMurtry supported the idea of a referendum question on global disarmament. He also presented supporting documentation from a lawyer consulted by the group, David Wright of

Toronto.

Cavan Council voted in favour of including the question on the ballot by a margin of four to one. Reeve Vic Norman, the lone dissenting voice, concluded by saying "I'm fighting this as a legal issue. I'm not against disarmament."

Each of the other members of Council spoke out individually in support of including the question.

Millbrook Council, after studying the information submitted by People for Peace solicitor David Wright, also confirmed that they would include the question on the ballot.

Positions on Millbrook's P.U.C. won by acclamation

The four positions offered on the Millbrook Public Utilities Commission have been won by acclamation. Chairman Glenn Fallis, Harry Williams, and Brian Taylor retain their positions, while Geoff Elton fills the position left vacant by John Dike.

The P.U.C. has won praise in the past for its efforts to keep charges to a minimum. When Ontario Hydro announced a rate hike of 9.5 percent to the Utility effective January 1985, Millbrook P.U.C. raised residential rates by only 1.5 percent. Commercial rates rose 1.8 per-

cent. Glenn Fallis explained that it has been possible to avoid passing on the full increases partly because the Utility cuts costs by tendering for required work projects rather than using Ontario Hydro crews. He also cites realistic budgeting as a contributing factor to the P.U.C.'s success in keeping costs down.

Each year, the Utility has taken on a major upgrading project. Services are being extended to the Millbrook Meadows sub-division development this year. There are also plans to conduct an

engineering study to upgrade services in the downtown area. If upgrading goes ahead, it will be spread over a four year period, says Fallis, to keep rate increases down.

Still enthusiastic after working with P.U.C. for 15 years, Fallis hopes ratepayers will come forward and offer comments and suggestions to P.U.C. members. "We want to know if people are unhappy with the service they are getting," he states. "It would be great if people would send us a letter or come and talk to us and let us know what they think."

Reeves acclaimed in all three Municipalities

Candidates for the position of Reeve in all three municipalities have been acclaimed. Reeves Victor Norman (Cavan) and Gerry Todd (Millbrook) will each serve for a second term, while in South Monaghan, the position vacated by retiring reeve, George Dean.

Bill Jones of South Monaghan has also won a seat on council by acclamation in an uncontested bid for the position of deputy reeve. He has served as councillor for the past three years, and this year was elected chairman of the Arena Board.

The race for seats lies with the candidates for councillor in all three municipalities, and in the bid for the position of Public School Board trustee. The position of trustee has attracted four candidates: Fran Fearnley, Ernst Hadorn, Arthur Kilgour, and Lorne Trimble. The elected trustee will represent all three municipalities; Millbrook, Cavan, and South Monaghan, on the Peterborough County Board of Education (PCBE). (See Page 3)

For Separate School supporters, there is also a

decision to be made, with two candidates running for the single area position. (See Page 7)

In Millbrook, the election has attracted four new candidates who will vie for the four available positions with two of the

Lavern Gibson and Roly Hurley join Murray Farrow and George Branscombe in a bid for seats on Council.

In Cavan, there is a contest for the position of deputy reeve, with Ben Olan and Wilfred Gillis running. Both have held positions on Council for a number of years. Wilf Gillis has held the deputy reeve position for the past three years.

Two new candidates, Don Pritchard and John Pritchard, join incumbents Kathy MacGregor and Sherman Morrison in the race for three available councillor positions on Cavan Council.

South Monaghan has attracted the greatest number of candidates, with seven running for the three available seats on Council. One incumbent, Malcolm Syer will be joined by newcomers Jack Arthur, Hugh Bothwell, Ron Brown, Mark Grove, Marie Hough and Ivy Matwey.

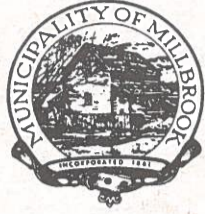

FRAN FEARNLEY

"I think schools in the community are finally being given a chance to settle down and plan for the future. However, I don't think we can afford to be complacent. The viability of keeping our local schools may well be questioned again, particularly since we can't predict the effects that separate school funding will have on the county. Three of the four area Principals listed a gymnasium at MIHS as the top priority. Many parents I talked to agreed this is the key issue. Perhaps next in line is the pupil/teacher ratio in our elementary grades. It is substantially higher than the provincial average. This can't be changed overnight but I would like to see long term planning in place to correct the situation. The provision of Special Education is another concern shared by parents and teaching staff."

Fran Fearnley has lived in the community for four and a half years. During this time she has shown an active interest in many aspects of community life. The following is a list of those involvements which are relevant to her nomination as Trustee. Fearnley acted as one of the support members to the Accommodation Study Committee which succeeded in keeping the High School open. She gave a presentation at the November Public Meeting, attended all the Board Meetings in Peterborough, organized community petitions and lobbied Trustees by letter. Until June 1985 Fearnley acted as Education Co-ordinator for the Millbrook Highlighter, a voluntary position which entailed liaising with teaching staff and supervising students' contributions to the paper. A founding member of the Friends of the Old Millbrook School, Fearnley is now working with this committee and MIHS staff to help develop a new Integrated Arts Program, scheduled to begin in January 1986.

Fearnley spent four years as a high school teacher of English and Theatre Arts. She has maintained a strong interest in educational issues and philosophies since leaving the teaching profession to pursue her writing career.

I will work towards:

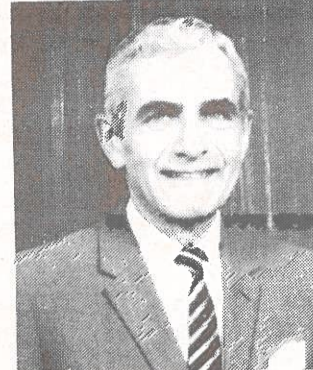

I am seeking election to the Board of Education because I have always been interested in the quality of education available to our youth. My educational degrees are from the University of Toronto. I was Associate Registrar and Director of Admissions at the University. I dealt with a great many schools and visited and spoke at many schools. Then in 1978-79 I was a member of a special committee of the Peterborough Board of Education. At that time I visited and interviewed staff and students at local schools. Due to the work of that committee the most unsatisfactory features of the values education program were removed from the curriculum.

I have been glad to serve our community on a number of local boards and committees including Cavan Council, the Medical Centre Board and the Arena Board. I was also a member of the founding Board of Millbrook Senior Citizens Residence.

I know that things can be done at the County Board of Education to improve the educational experience for children in this area. The opportunity for special education in local schools is limited. Adequate professional development is not available for teachers who have the responsibility of handling some of the books in the English literature programs. This problem affects students who attend local schools and those who go to Peterborough. Parents want optional texts available. These should be provided. Millbrook High is affected by fears and uncertainties about the future. Enrolment is down. Students are seeking the programs available in Peterborough. We all are concerned about the number of school buses. The Board of Education needs to exercise some imagination and look into the possibility of combining some of these services.

At the present time I can not think of a better way to serve the interests of people in the Cavan Millbrook South Monaghan area than by joining the Board of Education. Thank you.

Turnout Impressive in Local Elections

Despite frequent downpours and freezing rain, voter turnout on Election Day, November 12, was high in both Millbrook and the Township of South Monaghan. The number of voters in South Monaghan doubled over figures recorded five years ago (council was acclaimed in 1982), and in Millbrook 52 percent of eligible voters turned out

as compared to approximately 30 percent previously.

Fran Fearnley captured the Board of Education seat in a tight race involving four candidates. She will represent the municipalities of South Monaghan, Millbrook and Cavan on the county Board.

Elected to Millbrook Council are George Branscombe (incumbent), Leo Fallis, Roly Hurley, and Lavern Gibson. Reeve Gerry Todd retained his seat by acclamation.

Wilf Gillis was elected again to the position of deputy reeve in Cavan with Kathy McGregor and Sherman Morrison retaining their seats as councillors. Don Pritchard is the only new face

on Council, filling the position left by Ben Olan who contested the deputy-reeve position. Vic Norman was acclaimed as reeve.

In South Monaghan, both Anna Whittington as reeve and Bill Jones as deputy-reeve were acclaimed. In a bid by seven challengers for council seats, Hugh Bothwell, Mark Grove and Malcolm Syer came out winners.

In Cavan and Millbrook, a referendum ballot asked voters whether or not they were in favour of nuclear disarmament by all nations. In Cavan Township 76 percent of those who voted said yes, while in Millbrook, 68 percent supported the motion.

Edition honours memory of A.H. Armstrong

On Friday, November 1, Arnold Armstrong, a long time Millbrook resident and tenant at the Senior Citizens Complex, passed away at Peterborough Civic Hospital. Arnold will be remembered by many as editor and publisher of the Millbrook paper "The Chronicle" and as a regular columnist for the "Millbrook Highlighter". He will be sorely missed by family and friends.

Arnold was born in the village of Millbrook, but left with his family at an early age to homestead in Saskatchewan. After several years, the family returned to Millbrook and Arnold spent the rest of his boyhood in the area. He was educated at the

Millbrook public and high schools and took his first job at the Bank of Toronto in Millbrook. After 18 moves with the Bank, he decided a banking career was not for him. The next years of his life, however, saw him continue travelling from Vancouver to Lindsay, then Peterborough to the Canadian north, then to the St. Lawrence Seaway and finally back to Millbrook. During these years he held a variety of jobs such as accountant, and business manager for the Peterborough Clinic, and worked on construction projects like the DEW line, the St. Lawrence Seaway and Hwy 115.

Throughout these years he spent time as well on one of his most passionate

interests-journalistic writing. He worked as a freelance reporter specializing in sports reporting and this experience lead him to begin his own paper when he returned to Millbrook, "The Chronicle".

After Mr. Armstrong discontinued the Chronicle, he continued to write, working on the history of Millbrook. He owned a large number of original copies of the early newspapers published in Millbrook, and it was through his work on the history of the area that I got to know him personally. I always was phoning him up if I needed a detail or a gap to be filled in my work, and Arnold in his methodical way would always try to

assist. He often teased me, saying I was doing the 'seriously' work and he was chronically the more "human and earthy" side of Millbrook's past. But I always told him more people read his column "Do You Remember" than mine. I shall miss his words of wisdom and wit and the little twinkle he always had in his eye.

The first issue of the Millbrook Highlighter was

dedicated to Arnold Armstrong who was himself concerned with keeping the public informed and as he liked to say "keeping the politicians on their toes and honest". I know Arnold sincerely believed the Highlighter was accomplishing much for the community and so it is with the greatest of respect, that we at the Highlighter dedicate this issue to the memory of Arnold Armstrong.
